The assembly stands. All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the minister begins. The assembly reads the bold print.

Blessed be the holy Trinity, ✝ one God,
the fountain of living water,
the rock who gave us birth,
our light and our salvation.
Amen.

The minister addresses the assembly.

Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism,
we are clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness.
Let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.

We give you thanks, O God,
for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters
and by your Word you created the world,
calling forth life in which you took delight.

Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family.

Through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit.

By water and your Word you claim us as daughters and sons, making us heirs of your promise and servants of all.

We praise you for the gift of water that sustains life, and above all we praise you for the gift of new life in Jesus Christ. Shower us with your Spirit, and renew our lives with your forgiveness, grace, and love.

To you be given honor and praise
through Jesus Christ our Lord
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

Nourish our life in his resurrection, that we may bear the fruit of love and know the fullness of your joy, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

The assembly may be seated.

FIRST READING

Acts 8:26-40

Led by the Spirit, Philip encounters an Ethiopian official who is returning to his African home after having been to Jerusalem to worship. Philip uses their encounter to proclaim the gospel to him. Upon coming to faith in Jesus, he is baptized by Philip.

The reading is announced: A reading from Acts.

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³²Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter,
and like a lamb silent before its shearer,
so he does not open his mouth.

³³In his humiliation justice was denied him.
Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth.”

³⁴The eunuch asked Philip, “About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?” ³⁵Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, “Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?” ³⁸He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

SECOND READING

1st John 4:7-21

We love God and others because God first loved us. We cannot say we love God, whom we have not seen, while hating fellow Christians, whom we regularly see. Love toward God is to be matched by love toward others because the essence of God is love.

The reading is announced: A reading from 1st John.

⁷Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. ⁹God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. ¹⁰In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. ¹²No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

¹³By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. ¹⁵God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. ¹⁶So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. ¹⁷Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment,


because as he is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ¹⁹We love because he first loved us. ²⁰Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. ²¹The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

The reading is concluded: Holy Wisdom, Holy Word

The assembly responds: **Thanks be to God**

THE HOLY GOSPEL

John 15:1-8

On the night of his arrest, Jesus taught his disciples about the relationship they would have with him. Those who abide in his word and love bear fruit, for apart from him, they can do nothing.

The gospel is announced.

The Holy Gospel according to St. John.

The assembly responds:

Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said:] ¹“I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. ²He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. ³You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.”

The gospel concludes: The gospel of the Lord.
The assembly responds: **Praise to you, O Christ.**

PRESENTATION

The minister addresses the parent(s):

Parent(s) and Sponsor(s), called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have **Willow Mae Rupell** baptized into Christ?

Response: **We do.**

Parent(s), as you bring *Willow* to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with her among God's faithful people,
bring her to the word of God and the holy supper,
teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the
Ten Commandments,
place in her hands the Holy Scriptures,
and nurture her in faith and prayer,
so that she may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ
through word and deed, care for others and the world
God made, and to work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help her grow in the Christian faith and life?

Response: **We do.**

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The minister addresses the parent(s).

Parent(s) and Sponsor(s), do you profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church?

Response: **We do.**

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw us away from God?

Response: **We renounce them.**

The minister addresses the assembly.

People of God, do you promise to support *Willow* and pray for her in her new life in Christ?

Response: **We do.**

The assembly stands as able; the minister announces the Creed.

With the whole church, let us proclaim our faith together in the words of the Apostles' Creed.

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;

he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come to judge
the living and the dead.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,

The minister continues.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given all honor and praise, through Jesus Christ our Lord, ✠ in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

All respond: **Amen**

The assembly is seated.

HOLY BAPTISM

The minister continues with the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Water is poured over the candidate's head three times in the name of the triune God.

Willow Mae Rupell, I baptize thee in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All respond: **Amen**

The minister continues with the ancient ritual of the Laying on of Hands. The presiding minister prays:

Merciful God, sustain **Willow Mae** with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

All respond: **Amen**

The minister marks the sign of the cross ✠ on the forehead of the newly baptized. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says these words:

Willow Mae, child of God, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked ✠ with the cross of Christ forever.

All respond: **Amen**

BLESSING OF THE BAPTISM BLANKET

Blessed are you, Holy God, creator of the waters of the earth. Pour out your Holy Spirit upon this Baptism blanket handmade in prayer and love. In the name of the Father, ✙ the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen

WELCOME

A lighted candle is presented as the minister continues:

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus said: “Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.” May this candle be a symbol of remembrance of this day for *Willow* as she grows in faith.

The newly baptized is presented to the assembly as the minister continues with the “Welcome.”

Let us welcome ***Willow Mae Rupell***, the newest addition of God’s family here at Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church and God’s kingdom universal.

All may welcome the newly baptized with applause. The baptism candle is placed in the holder.

The family may be seated as the assembly sings the first verse of “Jesus Loves Me.”

The certificates are presented to the parents and sponsors.

The service continues with our tithes and offerings.

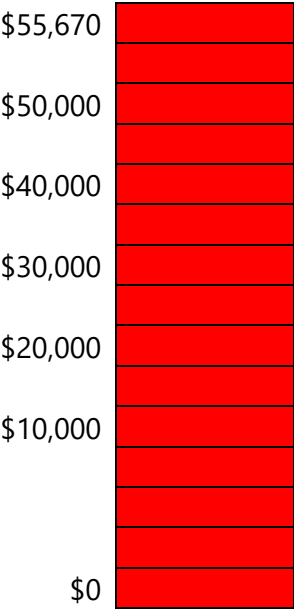

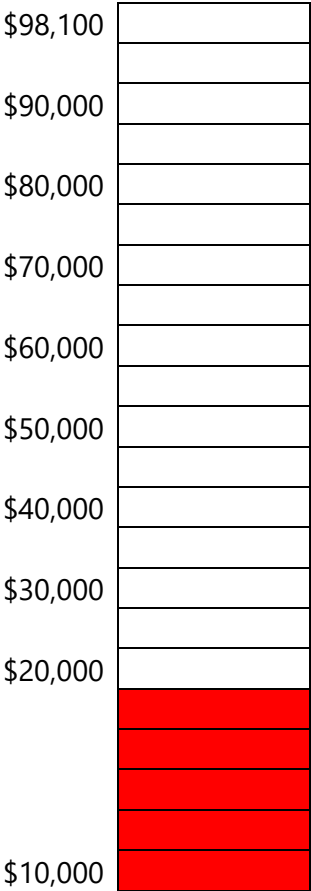
